45% More! The Lamp Takes a Giant Step

Every year brings positive change to the Lamp, but this year will be hard to beat. Starting in September, not only will the Lamp increase the number of patients it treats by 45%, it will also begin to provide specialized care for one of its important patient groups, children! In a matter of weeks, we will be enhancing the professional power of our staff with the skills of a full-time pediatrician. Lamp doctors can see 350 children in a month, so this added expertise will be fully utilized! It is very likely, too, that we will begin to see an even higher number of children as the community becomes aware of this special capability.

But the impact of this change on the clinic will be enormous. The change will be radically positive in some ways, but there will also be a price to pay. On the positive side, the addition of another doctor will have a very positive impact on the women's clinic. The prenatal program has been overwhelmed in recent months by a huge surge in the enrollment of pregnant patients. Adding a third doctor to the staff will allow the women's clinic director, Dr. Sévere, to dedicate a much higher percentage of her time to the prenatal program. Women will thus become the beneficiaries of the change as much as the children!

On the other side, though, there will be much added pressure on



The clinic is currently on a pace to treat 14,000 patients this year, but this is stretching our staff to the very limit. With an additional doctor, however, we hope to be able to see 20,000!

other services that the Lamp offers. Medicines and lab supplies must now increase by 45%; the patient load per nurse will increase by 45%; EKGs, X-rays, IVs, and ultrasounds will likewise increase.

The greatest impact, however, will be on our laboratory. Our lab has already been overwhelmed; it could not handle a patient increase of 5%, let alone 45%! We will, therefore, be renovating a previously purchased building to serve as a new, expanded laboratory. Also, a temporary lab is currently being furnished and can serve until the new one is ready. And a new laboratory technician will have taken up his or her job before this newsletter reaches you!

This tremendous change has been enabled by a five year grant from one of the Lamp's most stalwart supporters (thank you to the Tessiens!) and some generous donations in support of the women's clinic, but it is still a very ambitious effort. Available resources are never quite enough. The increased costs associated with expanding our patient base will, in fact, be the focus of our Benefit Dinner & Auction this Fall. But consider: serving 45% more people...markedly increasing the quality of care for children... enabling the expansion of our prenatal program...These are not challenges we should back away from!

SCHOOL SPONSORSHIP AT THE LAP

If you are reading this, you most likely grew up in a country that mandates or provides a means for education. Not true in the small town of Bwa Nèf, Cité Soleil, Haiti, where more than 50% of the children are uneducated and do not attend school due to the lack of books, uniforms, shoes and funding. In 2010, Lamp initiated a pilot program by placing a few children with École Mixte Enfant Jésus, a small independently owned school which is well established and located in the neighborhood. The program immediately took off and because of donor participation has grown to 30+ children of all different ages being able to attend school. The program not only educates the children but provides a purpose for them during the day and a goal to strive toward. Their gratitude towards those who have afforded them this opportunity is priceless. I have personally witnessed the excitement they have for being in school and the progress they have made.

Because of the huge success of this program, we have added an additional tutoring platform to enhance the program, hence, creating jobs within the community. Education has been proven to be the
